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# Math

- Business Calculus or MATH 1023 (A.S. CIT, BTECH and BA ECONS)
  - Student needs a “C” or better.
- Higher level of Calculus courses are acceptable.
  - Examples: Survey of Calculus or Calculus I
- **College Algebra** can be skipped if student has a Math ACT score of 26 or higher or a SAT score of 650 or above.
- Higher level Statistics courses are acceptable for Business Statistics.
- Example: Applied Statistics I



# COB Rules

- “C” or better in:
  - ENG 1003 & ENG 1013 – English Comp I & II.
  - MATH 2143 – Business Calculus  
OR MATH 1023 (BTECH and BA ECONS)
  - CIT 1503 – Microcomputer Applications
  - ACCT 2033 – Financial Accounting
  
- Have a 2.25 GPA in the following GPA areas:
  - Overall
  - Business Core (or all C’s)
  - Major Coursework (or all C’s).  
Except for ACCT 2.50 as of 15-16, and 2.00 in ECON B.A.,  
ECON Pre-Law B.A., and A.S. in CIT.
  
- Have a 2.00 GPA in Institution.
  
- Have 45 Jr/Sr credit hours taken after **30 earned hours.**
  
- 120+ overall earned hours.
  
- International Business, B.A. in Economics and Econ – Pre Law
  - All 12 hours of language MUST be taken in the same language.
  - Non-native English speakers may take 12 hours of Jr/Sr level English courses.

# 2017 Curriculum Changes

1. The College of Business will be removing the upper-level credit after 54 hours rule. **The new regulation will be upper-level credit completed after 30 credit hours.**
2. The below seven lower level core classes will **NO LONGER** be required to be completed before beginning upper level core classes:

Business Calculus; Business Statistics or **Applied Statistics**  
Intro to Financial Accounting; Intro to Managerial Accounting  
Macroeconomics; Microeconomics; and Microcomputer Applications

3. The college will **ONLY** be enforcing the direct prerequisite to our courses.
4. Intro to Anthropology and Intro to Sociology will **NO LONGER** be specifically required for the Social Sciences general education credit. The students will pick a Social Sciences general education class from the following:
  - ANTH 2233, Intro to Anthropology
  - CMAC 1003, Mass Communication
  - ECON 2333, Economic Issues & Concepts
  - GEOG 2613, Intro to Geography
  - HIST 1013, World Civilization to 1660
  - HIST 1023, World Civilization Since 1660
  - HIST 2763, US History to 1876
  - HIST 2773, US History Since 1876
  - POSC 1003, Introduction to Politics
  - POSC 2103, Intro to US Government
  - PSY 2013, Intro to Psychology
  - SOC 2213, Intro to Sociology



# 2017 Prerequisite Changes

- ACCT 3003: ACCT 2133, MATH 2143, STAT 3233 and CIT 1503; all with C or better.
- ACCT 3053: ACCT 2133, MATH 1023 or higher, and CIT 1503; all with C or better.
- ACCT 3063: ACCT 2133, MATH 1023 or higher, and CIT 1503; all with a C or better.
- ACCT 4013: ACCT 2133, MATH 2143, STAT 3233, CIT 1503 and LAW 2023; all with a C or better.
- ACCT 4053: ACCT 3013, STAT 3233; all with a grade of C or better.
- ACCT 4153: ACCT 2133, MATH 2143, STAT 3233, and CIT 1503; all with a grade of C or better.
  
- CIT 4653: CIT 2033, CIT 2523 and Corequisite CIT 3603
  
- FIN 3763: ECON 2313 and FIN 3713
- FIN 3773: MATH 2143 or MATH 2194 or MATH 2204, ECON 2113 or STAT 3233 and FIN 3713
- FIN 3813: FIN 3713
- FIN 4013: FIN 4723
- FIN 4723: ECON 2113 or STAT 3233 and FIN 3713
- FIN 4743: ECON 2113 or STAT 3233 and FIN 3713
- FIN 4753: ECON 2113 or STAT 3233 and FIN 3713
- FIN 4763: ECON 2313 and FIN 3713
  
- MGMT 3153: 45 Hour Requirement, No specific class prerequisite.

NOTE: Global Supply Chain Management courses have changed from the MKTG prefix to GSCM.
