MSW PROGRAM

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Completed SW application with Graduate School
- Personal and professional orientation paper
- Resume
- Social work references (3)
- Transcript GPA last 60 hours undergraduate degree
- Standard program GPA 3.0
- Advanced standing program GPA 3.2

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Advanced

- Requires 36 hours in concentration courses
- Eligibility: BSW within the past six years with a minimum 3.2 GPA in the last 60 hours of undergraduate work completed at the time of application.
- Available full-time (12 months) or part-time (two years)

Standard

- Requires 63 hours of graduate work (27 hours foundation courses and 36 hours in concentration courses)
- Eligibility: minimum GPA 3.0 in the last 60 hours of undergraduate work completed at the time of application from an accredited college or university. Designed for persons with degrees other than BSW.
- Available full-time (two years) or part-time (four years)

MALPRACTICE INSURANCE

Before being assigned to clinical practicums, all students in the College of Nursing and Health Professions' programs are required to purchase malpractice/liability coverage.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS AND DRUG TESTING

Based on legislation in Arkansas, students admitted to professional programs that require licensure in the state upon graduation are required to have a successful background check to complete formal admission. Information for obtaining the background check and drug test is provided by the program. Costs are borne by the students.
