- II. - III. Guest Speaker: Dr. Alan Utter, Provost
  - Initiated a taskforce for program viability, which spent one year defining metrics used to assess programs, then began data collection. The programs were assessed in ten different metrics, such as how many students are enrolled, the cost of the program, etc.
  - O This year, the program viability committees are looking at the data. The first committee, comprised of faculty from the program, made one of four recommendations: grow the program, maintain where the program is, transform the program, or suspend the program. This committee submitted recommendations to Deans, and Deans submitted their recommendations back to the taskforce on November 17.
  - o The taskforce will have until February 4, 2022 to submit their recommendations to the Provost. The provost will then present these recommendations to the Chancellor, and the Chancellor will take the recommendations to the Board of Trustees.
  - o Taskforce II Holistic Admissions Policy. Standardized tests are now optional for admission to A-State. If students opt out of testing, they may be admitted if they meet one of the following criteria: An ACT score of 19, the student is in the top 20% of their graduating class, or a 3.0 GPA.
  - o Discussions are underway about starting a veterinarian school on campus. If all goes as planned, A-State could be admitting its first class of veterinarian students in Fall 2025.
  - A-State continues to promote research on campus. The university was recently moved to be an R2-level institution. To maintain this R2 level, A-State is required to graduate a certain number of doctoral students, as

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well continue to bring in external funding. In July 2021, A-State hit a record high of external funding.

- O Another taskforce was charged to look at A-State's general education curriculum. General education has been focused on taking so many classes in a certain discipline; the taskforce is looking at moving towards a more thematic general education curriculum. The taskforce is now building out these themes and choosing classes to fit those themes. If anyone has input about these themes, or suggestions about what courses could be taught, reach out to the GEC taskforce or a member of the GEC.
- New Academic Affairs and Research Leadership: Aiming to have the new AVC for Assessment and Accreditation started by the first day of classes for Spring 2022. The search for the AVC for Faculty Affairs is ongoing and applications are still being accepted.
