#### **Outstanding Undergraduate Awards**

Awards are given annually to outstanding graduating seniors pursuing a BA or BSE in World Languages and Cultures in French or Spanish. #### R.E. Lee Wilson Award

The R. E. Lee Wilson Award is the university's highest honor for a student who best exemplifies qualities of character, determination, involvement, and academic achievement. Anna Callaway, the 2010 academic year winner of the Wilson Award, is from Warren in Bradley County. ## SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS

#### Academic Performance Scholarship

#### Angelo Humanities and Social Sciences Scholarship

Annual Scholarship in the amount of \$500 awarded to a full-time undergraduate student with 60 credit hours who is pursuing a degree program within the College of Humanities and Social Sciences. Applicants must have an overall 3.25 grade point average. Consideration is given to participation in programs and service to the College. Application deadline is typically early November. #### Edgar and Vera Kirk Scholarship Endowment

This scholarship is available for any major within the College of Humanities Social Sciences. Eligible students must be from the Arkansas counties of Independence, Izard and Stone, in addition to a minimum high school GPA of 3.0 and an ACT score of 23. Approximate award is full tuition and fees, with possible renewal for three additional years.

Undergraduate students at all levels from freshmen to seniors will be considered; World Languages and Cultures majors are encouraged to apply during their freshman and sophomore year. Application deadline is typically early November. #### McFarland Academic Freedom Scholarship

The Arkansas State University chapter of the American Association of University Professors (AAUP) announces the competition for the annual C.K. and Linda McFarland Academic Freedom Scholarship at ASU. The

annual scholarship, worth \$1000, is open to all full-time current or summer Junior, Senior, or Graduate students at Arkansas State University. The winner may use the scholarship for Spring, Summer, or Fall of the current academic year on educational expenses at ASU-Jonesboro. The student may have any major, and must have at least a 3.0 overall grade-point-average.

Application guidelines and forms are available from Department and the Dean's offices in Wilson Hall. Completed applications, which will include a brief essay on the meaning of academic freedom, are typically due in May.

The C.K. and Linda McFarland Academic Freedom Scholarship was created by Drs. C.K. and Linda McFarland, who served as faculty members in the ASU Department of History. After Dr. C.K. McFarland completed 11 years as department Chair in 1982, he held a joint appointment as Professor of History and Management (Industrial Relations) until his retirement in 1997. He served as President of the ASU chapter of the AAUP, and was instrumental in revitalizing the association on both the ASU-Jonesboro campus and state-wide.

#### Middle East Studies Grant

The ASU Middle East Studies Committee (MESC) encourages an awareness and understanding of issues and people of the Middle East. Each year, the committee awards parts of its budget, the income from an endowment given to ASU by the Saudi government, to ASU students, faculty and staff for study and/or research in the Middle East. The Committee welcomes grant applicants from all disciplines and from all ASU-Jonesboro colleges.

The committee seeks proposals identifying specific areas of academic interest and a detailed plan by which the applicant will conduct the study or research. In addition, student/staff proposals must include a description of how the study will benefit the applicant and faculty proposals must include a well-defined plan of how the faculty member will disseminate the research findings. Preference will be given to applicants who have not received a grant in the past three competitions.

In order to qualify for the grant competition, the applicant must be a student or full-time faculty or staff member at ASU-Jonesboro. The proposals must include on-site research in one of the designated countries of the Middle East (Algeria, Bahrain, Djibouti, Egypt, Ethiopia, Israel, Iran, Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Morocco, Oman, Palestine Authority, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Sudan, Syria, Tunisia, Turkey, United Arab Emirates, and Yemen.) Other restrictions apply. All study or research must be completed by December of the grant year. Applications are typically due early in January of the grant year.

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# SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS SPECIFICALLY FOR STUDENTS PURSUING A DEGREE IN TEACHER EDUCATION

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(BSE Majors)

#### **Eunitha Steel Hout Commitment to Education Award**

Award is given to an incoming ASU Freshman, who has graduated from Buffalo Island Central High and plans to pursue a field of study in elementary or secondary education. First preference will be given to students from Monette or Leachville, Arkansas. If there are no qualified students from those areas, the scholarship may then be awarded to a student from Craighead County who otherwise qualifies for the award. In the event that Buffalo Island Central High School either merges with another institution or ceases to operate, the scholarship may be awarded to students from Monette or Leachville who otherwise qualify for the award.

Consideration is given to financial need and determination of strong moral character. Applicant must provide a written essay to Scholarship Committee. Recipients are eligible to reapply for consideration provided that they have continued in the course of study in elementary or secondary education and have maintained a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above (3.0 on a 4.0 scale) or its equivalent.

#### Hester M. Waddill Scholarship

Scholarship is awarded to full-time student at junior or senior level who has been admitted to the Teacher Education Program. Candidates must have a grade point average of 3.3 (3.3 on a 4.0 scale). First preference is given to student preparing for careers in public education at the K-4 level.

Students must be a graduate of an Arkansas high school. In additional to academic achievement other factors may be considered, but which are not mandatory include evidence of the applicant's involvement in civic or community affairs, student government, athletics, the arts and music.

The award is not automatically renewable; however, previous recipients may reapply. Selection is made by the Department of Teacher Education Scholarship Committee

#### Lillian Barton Scholarship

The Lillian Barton Scholarship is named in honor of a special educator. Miss Barton rendered service to the teaching profession for more than 50 years. She was a public school teacher, school administrator, and

teacher educator. She has been characterized as a dedicated professional and a gracious lady. Miss Barton provided active and inspirational leadership to Eta Delta Chapter of Kappa Delta Pi for many years; therefore, it seems only fitting that this chapter assume responsibility for the administration of the Lillian Barton Memorial Scholarship Fund. To finance the scholarships, an endowment was established by donations from relatives of Miss Barton, friends, and organizations. The interest from the endowment provides scholarships for deserving teacher education majors.

The recipients are selected on the bases of GPA and evidence of professional promise. The scholarship is awarded in the fall and spring semesters. Those submitting an application packet BSE Spanish major Jennifer Lynn won the Lillian Barton Scholarship in Spring Semester 2010.

#### Mary L. Swan Memorial Scholarship

Mrs. Swan was a native of Randolph County, Arkansas. She attended Pocahontas Elementary School and Pocahontas High School. Pocahontas High School was her favorite high school, but she was unable to graduate from there because her parents moved to Walnut Ridge. She, consequently, graduated from Walnut Ridge High School.

Mrs. Swan attended Ft. Smith Junior College for two years prior to attending and graduating from Arkansas State College. She obtained her Remedial Reading Certificate by attending the University of Arkansas and Arkansas State University.

Mrs. Swan began her teaching career as a sixth grade teacher at the Alma Spikes Elementary School in Pocahontas, AR. In that district, she, by choice, taught only sixth graders for eight years. In the St. Charles Missouri School district, Mrs. Swan taught fourth grade for one year and then became the remedial reading teacher for 20 years. Mrs. Swan taught a total of 29 years in the Pocahontas School and St. Charles School Districts.

Mr. and Mrs. Swan planned together to set-up a scholarship to help students pursue an elementary education degree. This scholarship is in her honor because she enjoyed working with students so much and knew that all students could be successful if motivated to do his/her very best.

located in Lawrence County, Randolph County, and Greene County in Northeast Arkansas, or from the Highland School District in Sharp County, Arkansas. Transfer students are eligible to apply only if he/she has attended an ASU branch, and graduated from one of the above mentioned schools.

- 2. Second preference is that award be to a student currently enrolled.
- 3. Must be a full-time student pursing an elementary or secondary education degree with a minimum grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- 4. Financial need must be documented.
- 5. Demonstrate the abilities, personal qualities and scholarship conducive to become an outstanding teacher
- 6. Award is renewable through completion of the undergraduate degree of six (6) additional semesters, whichever occurs first, provided recipient continues to meet all award criteria.

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#### **Minority Teacher Scholars Program**

The Minority Teacher Scholars Program (MTSP) provides forgivable loans to African-American, Asian American, Native American, and Hispanic students attending Arkansas higher education institutions with approved teacher education programs. <u>Go to Top</u> <u>Go to Dept. MTSP scholars must commit to teaching in an Arkansas public school for five (5) years after completing teacher licensure requirements. The teaching requirement will be reduced to three (3) years for teaching in one of the 42 counties in Arkansas designated as the Delta Region or for teaching a subject declared to be a critical subject shortage area by the Arkansas Department of Education.

#### STAR Forgivable Loan

The Arkansas State Teacher Assistance Resource (STAR) provides forgivable loans to students pursuing an education degree leading to an initial teacher licensure. Recipients must teach in designated subject and/or geographical critical shortage areas in Arkansas public schools after completion of licensure requirements.

A student may be eligible for a STAR Forgivable Loan for a maximum of 2 years (if in a 4-year program) or 3 years (if in a 5-year program) or until licensure requirements are completed, whichever comes first. STAR funds are paid to the recipient's college or university for each term awarded.

#### Study Abroad Financial Aid Websites:

<u>AIFS Minority Scholarships</u> are awarded one per semester, full tuition for an AIFS study abroad program. One hundred AIFS International Scholarships are awarded annually---\$1000 toward an AIFS program.

<u>American Association of University Women</u> - the largest source of funding exclusively for graduate women in the world, supports aspiring scholars around the globe, teachers and activists in local communities, women at critical stages of their careers, and those pursuing professions where women are underrepresented.

<u>American Austrian Foundation</u>: Offers numerous awards to support exchanges to Austria in the fields of medicine, science, communications and the arts. Level: varies by award / Award amount: varies

<u>Association of Commonwealth Universities</u> - Provides lists of scholarships and fellowships to and from over 480 universities drawn from the Commonwealth countries of Africa and Asia, Australasia and the South Pacific, Canada and the Caribbean, the United Kingdom, Cyprus and Malta.

<u>DAAD - German Academic Exchange Service</u> - The Undergraduate Scholarship is a flexible scholarship program which offers SHORT-TERM scholarships for participation in summer study abroad, internships, senior thesis research or summer courses at German universities and LONG-TERM scholarships for semester or year study abroad. <u>Deutscher Akademischer</u> <u>Austauschdienst (DAAD) - German Academic Exchange Service</u> - association of the institutions of higher education in the Federal Republic of Germany, whose goal is to promote closer international relations among universities and other institutions of higher education, especially through the exchange of individual students and scholars.

Delta Phi Alpha Scholarship Awards: The national honor society for German awards scholarships to undergraduate student members wishing to further their German studies with



research and study abroad in a German-speaking country. Level: undergraduate / Award amount: \$1000-\$2000

Entente Cordiale Entente Cordiale scholarships are awarded to outstanding British and French post-graduate, doctoral and post-doctoral students - all subjects - to study or undertake research for an academic year on the other side of the Channel.

<u>Fulbright Scholarships</u> - For both Americans going abroad and incoming foreign students. Grants are made to citizens of participating countries, primarily for: university teaching, advanced research, graduate study and teaching in elementary and secondary schools.

<u>Change Ambassadors Grant</u> - Up to \$5000 for the transportation and program costs for a volunteer program organized by Travelocity's Travel for Good program. Participating programs include Earthwatch and Cross-Cultural Solutions; Competitive application with awards based in part on financial need.

<u>Child Family Health International</u> - Offering partial (\$1000) and full scholarships during 2008 and 2009. Scholarships are to be used toward the program fees for CFHI programs. Scholarships available during certain months only Scholarships will be given to students who demonstrate a commitment to their communities as well as financial need and an interest in exchanging ideas and sharing experiences with people in Bolivia, Ecuador, India, Mexico and South Africa. Priority will be given to people of ethnicities underrepresented in CFHI programs, as well as those who have had limited opportunity to travel abroad and no prior international health experience.

<u>The Christianson Grant</u> The Christianson Grant through The Interexchange Foundation is open to applicants who have sought out and arranged their own work, intern, or volunteer programs abroad. Two awards of \$10,000 for 12+ months; 2 awards of \$5000 for 6+ months; 4 awards of \$2,500 for 6+ will be given.

<u>CIEE International Study Programs (CIEE-ISP) Scholarships</u>: Scholarships each year to students who demonstrate both academic excellence and financial need and who are applicants from an Academic Consortium member institution (list is <u>here</u>). Applications are reviewed based upon the information provided including financial need, academic achievement, the Personal Statement essay, and recommendations. Level: CIEE program participants / Award amount: \$500 - \$1000 toward program fees

<u>Congress - Bundestag Youth Exchange Program</u>: Scholarship program that facilitates cultural exchange for American and German young adults in the business, vocational, technical, and agricultural fields. 75 Americans and 100 Germans are selected annually. 12-month program includes support for intensive language instruction, university classes, and a 5-month career-related internship. Funds round-trip airfare, language study and university classes, living stipend. Level: high school diploma, undergraduate, or graduate / Award amount: varies

<u>Cross-Cultural Solutions</u> (CCS) Each year, CCS supports over 4,000 people volunteering abroad in Africa, Asia, Latin America, and Eastern Europe to work in the areas of <u>care-giving</u>, <u>teaching</u>, <u>healthcare</u>, and community <u>development</u>.





<u>Department of Education Scholarship for Programs in China</u>: Provides financial assistance to students who are participating in the Chinese language programs offered by the CIEE Centers at Peking University (Beijing), East China Normal University (Shanghai), Nanjing University, and National Chengchi University (Taipei). Participants are integrated into the life of the host country. Program details differ from country to country, but participants receive a stipend, paid round-trip airfare, and other benefits. Applicants must have B.A. at time the award year begins. Level: B.A. in hand / Award amount: varies

<u>Fulbright Travel Grants</u>: To pay round trip travel expenses to study abroad programs in Germany, Hungary, Italy in cases where the cost of travel is not covered by the program fees. Level: all / Award amount: varies

<u>German Academic Exchange Service</u> (for US or Canadian students) <u>German Academic Exchange Service</u> (for students outside US and Canada) Offers 9 different types of scholarships, grants, and fellowships for study and research in Germany. There are awards for undergraduate students to post-doctoral scholars in every field imaginable. Ranges from financial support for 3-week courses to full-year financial support for an academic year abroad. Level: any / Award amount: varies

<u>Gilman International Scholarship Program</u> - The Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship program is sponsored by the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs of the U.S. Department of State and administered by the Institute of International Education. This program seeks to lower barriers to undergraduate study abroad by offering scholarships to students with financial need, and we encourage those underrepresented in study abroad to apply. The award is up to \$5,000 for semester or academic year programs.

<u>Golden Key Study Abroad Scholarships</u>: Ten scholarships awarded annually for members of the Golden Key Honor Society for undergraduate study abroad.
