



Saculty Spotlight

he Division of White-Collar and Corporate Crime Student Paper Committee Division recently nominated and awarded A-State's Dr. Averi Fegadel, Assistant Professor of Criminology, for her article "Toxic Colonialism and Green Victimization of Native Americans: An Examination of the Genocidal Impacts of Uranium Mining." This award recognizes exceptional scholarship by students working independently of faculty. In her nomination, she was cited for the "groundbreaking nature of the research endeavor in its attention to how certain forms of structurally generated victimization adversely impact racial and ethnic minorities... which is more than an accidental public health problem, but more precisely, an active form of conscious victimization."



Dr. Fegadel will receive her award at the 2021 American Society of Criminology meeting in Chicago. On behalf of the entire CSG Department, Congratulations Dr. Fegadel!



uring the Law and Society Annual Conference, A-State's Dr. Della J. Winters, Assistant Professor of Sociology, emphasis in Criminal Justice, presented her findings. Drawing on 33 interviews of stakeholders in criminal justice, reproductive healthcare, state social services, non-profit organizations, and community organizers in Tennessee, her research highlighted the impact of converging state-based austerity practices and concluded the neoliberal "solution" led to the emergence of long-acting reversible contraceptives to control reproduction among criminalized people.





In a recent study co-presented by Dr. Sanjeev Acharya at the Stanford Maternal and Child Health Research Institute, findings in the link between maternal gender discrimination and emotional/behavior problems among children 7-15 in a European cohort were discussed. He also co-authored articles in Journal of Racial and Ethnic Disparities and Reproductive Health examining caste differences in hypertension among women in India, and perception and practices of menstruation restrictions in Nepal.

Dr. Kellie Wilson-Buford

Associate Professor of History Interim Chair - CSG

Kellie Wilson Buford is an Associate Professor of History and served as the BSE Social Science Director at Arkansas State University for 7 years before becoming Interim Chair of CSG in 2021. Before she entered academia, she taught high school history and English as a second language. Her background as a military brat and a military spouse took her all over the world and planted the seeds for her research interests. Dr. Buford has won the College of Liberal Arts and Communications Faculty Research Award and, most recently, the University Faculty Achievement Award in Advising. Her publications have been featured in various journals and edited volumes including the *Journal of Homosexuality, Military History of the West, The Rise and Fall of Don't Ask, Don't Tell*, and the forthcoming *Managing Sex in the U.S. Military*.

After publishing her first book, *Policing Sex and Marriage in the American Military: The Court-Martial and the Construction of Gender and Sexual Deviance, 1950-2000*, in 2018, Dr. Buford started working on her current book project under advanced contract with University of Nebraska Press. Tentatively titled *Sexual Violence and American Military Justice from the Korean War to the Present*, the book maps the United States military justice system's historic policies and practices to manage crimes of sexual violence in order to contextualize current policy debates and offer effective soluctions. Kellie teaches undergraduate and graduate courses on the twentieth century world, comparative women, gender, and sexuality, war, militarization and empire, US foreign relations, U.S. constitutional history, the history of food, the history of global diversity, and the history of policing, marriage, and the rise of the surveillance state. Kellie is a full-time mother of two amazing kiddos and five rescue pets. In her free time, she loves to garden, exercise, do DIY projects, and read whatever she can get her hands on. Kellie is excited to work with the amazing faculty, staff, and students in the CSG department.


