

Dr. Edward Salo presented "Changing Centuries of Grand Strategy: Great Britain's Response to Russia's Invasion of Ukraine and the Opportunity for Reintegration into Europe" at the EU Academy Conference on European Security.

McNamee has accepted an Assistant Professor of History position at Washington State University, starting Fall 2024. Congrats on the new position; we know you'll be amazing!


We hate to see her go; but she'll be back to do research; she's still an Arkansas historian!

In February, Conway also participated in a roundtable discussion on the history of the Graduate Association for African American History (GAAAH) at the University of Memphis. In April, Conway's class went to the Civil Rights Museum in Memphis, TN. Conway was also awarded the Outstanding Faculty for the second year from the Black Student Association.



Dr. Kellie Wilson-Buford was invited to present at a symposium on the "U.S. Army and Social Change" at Columbus State University Feb 23-24. She presented work for a forthcoming edited volume called "Managing Sex Deviates in the U.S. Army: The Presidio of San Francisco and the Baker Street Scandal of 1918."

In June, **Dr. Gary Edwards** will present "The Legacy of a Disgruntled Rebel and Galvanized Yankee During the Jubilee: Revealing and Concealing, Disloyalty and Desertion" at the Society of Civil War Historians in Raleigh, North Carolina.

The Society of Civil War Historians is the top scholarly organization in the country for the study of the Civil War.





<u>Dr. Lucy Barnhouse</u> presented "Christ's Poor, God's Servants: Hospital Communities and Social Liminality at the Sewanee Medieval Colloquium in Sewanee, Tennessee. The College of Liberal Arts and Communication awarded Barnhouse funds for traveling here.

Barnhouse will also present "Teaching Against Decline: Medieval Medical History" at the International Medieval Congress in Kalamazoo, Michigan. She also received the Faculty Scholarship Award for 2023-2024. And the Emerging Scholar Award at the Faculty Honors Convocation.





In July, <u>Dr. Justin Castro</u> will present "The Mansion of Salina Cruz, Mexico: Engineers, Labor, and the Politics of the World's First Stationary Dredge" at the Society for the History of Technology (SHOT) in Viña del Mar.




