Admission into the Teacher Education Program

Students making formal application into the teacher education program must meet the following admission requirements.

Admission Requirements

- 1. Attain minimum passing scores on the Praxis CORE tests for reading, math and writing tests or has a minimum composite score of 24 on the ACT with scores of at least 22 in reading, 22 in mathematics, and 22 in English/Writing. The composite of 24 must be attained to consider any single ACT exam. If one or more of the ACT exams do not meet the qualifying scores you may take a single CORE exam.
- 2. Attain minimum overall GPA of 2.70 for admission into the Teacher Education Program.
- 3. Complete ENG 1003, ENG 1013, MATH 1023, SCOM 1203 and Introduction to Education classes with a grade of "C" or better in each.
- 4. Complete minimum of 30 semester hours
- 5. Complete an evaluation of Career Decision Awareness
- 6. Submit a completed application form
- 7. Submit a two-page typewritten philosophy of education
- 8. Obtain a signed Clarification of Teacher Education Admissions/Retention Standards
- 9. Appear individually for a personal interview
- 10. Verify no conviction of a felony or crimes
- 11. Verify that student has received a copy of the Conceptual Framework

Graduation Requirements

Students are required to take and pass the Praxis Content and Praxis II Pedagogy assessments specified for their licensure area prior to graduation.
